86 <p>An interesting story is related about the appearance of the mine. According to the
87 legend <em>Kinga</em>, a daughter of <em>Hungarian King Bela IV</em>, before
88 getting married threw her wedding ring in a chasm. This ring together with the
89 deposits of stone salt moved to Wieliczka in a magic way. Since then they have been
90 mining salt here and Kinga was considered the patroness of miners and salt diggers.
91 One of the caverns is called <em><q>St.Kinga's chapel</q></em>.

103 <p>It looks like a huge hall made of a unique salt chunk polished to such an extent
104 that a dance tournament might be organized here. There are beautiful High reliefs on
105 the walls with famous biblical scenes such as Leonardo's <em><q>The Last Supper</q></em> or
106 <em><q>The Running to Egypte</q></em>. The hall is lit with luxurious chandeliers made
107 of salt crystals. The chapel is a place of religious devotion. Liturgies for significant
108 events as well as concerts of organ music take place here.
